MEETING NOTICE – PUBLIC WORKS AND UTILITIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

ROUTINE ITEMS TO BE ACTED UPON:

1. **Call to order/Roll Call:** Ed Kazik called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Roll call: Ed Kazik (Village Board), Dave Baranczyk, Dan Deruyter, Richard Happel, Don Dahlstrom, David Smith, Kyle Schmitz (Alternate) were present. Excused: Tim Carpenter (Village Board),
2. **Certification of the open meeting law agenda requirements and approval of the agenda.** Motion made by Ed Kazik, second by Don Dahlstrom to approve the agenda as presented. The motion passed unanimously.
3. **Approval of Minutes – January 14th 2019:** Motion made by Dave Baranczyk, second by Don Dahlstrom to approve the minutes from January 14, 2019. The motion passed unanimously.

ACTION ITEMS

4. **DISCUSSION AND ACTION – Hillcrest Elementary School Safety Improvements Project.** Jerry Lancelle brought the estimates to the committee for the crosswalk improvement proposals. The estimated cost for the basic crosswalk is \$46,200.00. Both the Village and Pulaski School District would not be able to provide any assistance with the costs for 2019, they would discuss it for the 2020 budget but cannot guarantee it would be approved. We would apply for grants through the Safe Routes to Schools programs, but with no sidewalks in any of the subdivisions, our application may not be considered. There is no connectivity through a sidewalk system. Resident Katrina Schock said she would speak with the homeowner's association and poll them about the number of children who may actually use the crosswalk. A new traffic counts will be taken this year. Maintenance costs for the proposed cross walk were discussed. Questions from discussion:

1. Is there an approximate number of children who would actually walk to school and use the crosswalk?
2. Would parents actually allow children to walk / bike to school with no sidewalks in subdivisions?
3. Will Pulaski include in the Budget for 2020. If so, what amount would they consider?
4. Will Pulaski change the policy requiring children having to be bussed to Hillcrest?

No action was taken on this matter.

5. UPDATE – Director and Activity Reports:

Mr. Lancelle gave an update on the 2019 Road Improvement Work and the 2019 Drainage Improvements to the committee. There will be 14-inlets repaired in Thornberry and Polo point with this contract. In total, there are 451 inlets that need to be repaired / replaced within those two systems. The water tower project will start again when the weather warms up.

6. ADJOURNMENT: Motion made by Richard Happel, second by David Smith, to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 6:45pm.
